Resurrection Morning

This year it was raining, so we could not go to the cemetery for the sunrise service. Too wet. The clouds scudding low over the Nebraska hills hid the sunrise from our view anyway. But the sun still rose, appearing briefly later in the day.

Many of you know that the past several years my wife and I have become "Christmas and Easter members" of our son's parish in central Nebraska. His congregation is actually an amalgamation of two congregations, the one in town, the other 7 miles out in the country. When the two merged, they moved the parsonage into town and built a new church. The only thing left at the country site is the cemetery. That's where, every Easter at sunrise, they gather for a service. It's a beautiful spot on a hill facing east and a moving service, standing amongst the graves of those who have gone before. But this year we stayed in town, inside where it was dry.

No matter. The Son still rose! At early dawn, as the Scripture says, "*On the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared*" (Luke 24:1). When the women who had come looked down into the tomb, there was no body there! He was gone. Two angels broke the unbelievable news, "*Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen!*" (Luke 24:5-6). It was just as He had told them. He would be given into the hands of sinful men. They would kill Him, but on the third day He would rise.

50 days later on Pentecost, before some of the very people who had called for Jesus' death, Peter stood and proclaimed, "*This Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. God raised Him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for Him to be held by it*" (Acts 2:23-24). Because He is the Author of Life, there was no way death could maintain its icy grip on Him. As the Lutheran pastor and hymnwriter, Paul Gerhardt, teaches us to sing: "*My Lord will leave me never, whate'er He passeth through. He rends death's iron chain, He breaks through sin and pain, He shatters hell's grim thrall, I follow Him through all*" (TLH 192, st.6).

There's the reason we go to the cemetery for the sunrise service. It was from the grave that Jesus rose again. And it will be from the grave that Jesus will call us out on that great resurrection morning to come. "*I follow Him through all.*" Here's also how Jesus' resurrection becomes ours.

It begins when we are “buried with Him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His” (Romans 6:4-5). This new life continues when He calls us daily to deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Him (Matthew 16:24). Jesus Himself feeds this life when, again and again, He gives us the bread of life. “I am the living bread that came down from heaven,” Jesus said, “if anyone eats of this bread he will live forever. And the bread that I shall give is my flesh for the life of the world” (John 6:51).

What do we have to give Him in return? Everything we have comes from Him. Oh, except for one thing. There is one thing we have we did not receive from Him. And that’s our death, caused by our sin.

Yet, and here is the greatest wonder of all, our death is exactly what He has come to take. It is the one thing we have to give, but it’s also the one thing God can work with. After all, He’s in the business of raising the dead. It’s what He does best, in fact.

So we daily die to sin and rise again in Christ. We confess our guilt because He’s going to remove it. We give Him our death so that He can raise us to life. “For this is the will of Him who sent Me,” Jesus told His disciples, “that I should lose nothing of all that He has given Me, but raise it up at the last day. For this is the will of my Father,” He continued, “that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in Him should have eternal life, and I will raise Him up on the last day” (John 6:39-40).

Maybe next year we will be back in the cemetery for Easter sunrise unless, of course, Jesus comes back first! What a glorious resurrection morning that will be! Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!

A group of 27 Christians from the Edwardsville area participated in a medical mission trip to Tegucigalpa, Honduras in early February 2009. The group known as “Starfish Enterprise” provided ministry care in the following areas: optical, dental, general medical, and pharmaceutical. Other ministry activities included an evangelism station where the Gospel was shared with over 3,200 Hondurans.
